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A Domestic Violence Order is a court document.
It is also called a DVO.
A DVO tries to keep a person safe from domestic violence.

The **aggrieved** is the person who needs protection from **domestic violence**.



The **respondent** is the person who needs to follow the rules of the **DVO**.

All **DVOs** have the rule that the **respondent** needs to be 'of good behaviour' to the **aggrieved**.



This means they are **not** allowed to use violence against the **aggrieved**.





Some **DVO**s have extra rules. For example, the **respondent** is **not** allowed to call the **aggrieved**.



You can get help to understand what your **DVO** means.

violence service closest to you.

How do I get a DVO?



You need to fill out a form to ask for a

DVO.

You need to give your personal details.



For example –

• your name



• your address.



You will need to write what kind of

domestic violence has happened to

you.



When you fill out the form by yourself this is called a **private DVO**.



A domestic violence worker can help you fill out the form.

A lawyer can also help you.



Sometimes the police fill this form out for you.

This is called a **police DVO**.



The police can take out a **DVO** even if you do **not** want one.



What is a Breach?

can get -



• a fine



• community service



• prison time
